

# A GRANDMA COUP

In the practical bridge theory grandma coup has a special place among winning strategies. Based on the myth that senior female bridge players are timid and tend to underbid their hand significantly, the grandma coup depicts a situation where slow bidder provokes a double by settling in an extremely safe contact with a whole load of extras at first, and then taking a push when opponents bid over it.

You pick up a nice black wood, ♠ A K 9 8 5 ♥ T ♦ J ♣ K J 8 5 4 3, and your grandma RHO opens a diamond. You bid your spades, LHO doubles and you partner shows at least four carded spade invite with 2NT. RHO passes, you bid your spade game, and LHO bids 5 diamonds passed out to you. After a short evaluation you bid 5 spades, hoping to make with no real vision how to set the opponents' diamond game making it a two way shot.

Your bid is passed out to your RHO, and after some thought grandma raises to 6 diamonds. You still do not have a real vision on how to set a high diamond contract and you pass hoping you pushed the opponents too high because spade slam seems unlikely to make. Your partner doubles making it the final contract.

Unfortunately, the board doesn't fit your needs as 6 diamonds is cold.

You've been grandma couped! The whole board:

The grandma in the West seat turns out to be Giorgio Duboin, the most exotic grandma you have played and one of the best tight bidding players in the world. He actually didn't like the odds for the slam on a trump lead facing a possible four card fit so he passed five diamonds, but after a push by North suggested huge diamond fit he did take a chance. He did consider doubling 5 spades and taking a "safe plus", but after some time the optimism prevailed. 1540 was worth 11 IMPs when the other room doubled five diamonds for an overtrick. A sacrifice in spades would have earned some points, but after a shy bidding by grandma neither North nor South were eager to go down in a slam in an unclear situation.

## **DIRECTOR'S CORNER**

Not a lot of rulings yet. The one I spent the most time on was the easiest to start with. A transfer was not alerted, which prevented the opponents from finding their game in hearts. But what should the correction be? After eliminating several other options, I was left with only two: four hearts by South (the non-offenders), just made, or four hearts by West (believing partner's misunderstood spade transfer until the very end!), down seven. In the end we decided on a simple +420.

Also interesting was, after ten years of directing at Pula, the first time I was allowed to give a ruling in my native tongue, Dutch. Two Dutch pairs were facing each other when one revoked. I would have been very surprised to hear a player address me in Dutch, in the presence of his opponents, but luckily I recognized one of them.

Please bear a thought for Gun Helness. (wife of the famous ...) She made a mistake like one we've all made in our long years of bridge, allowing a grand slam to be made despite holding four trumps to Queen-nine. But sadly for here, she did it in full view of the whole world, on BBO. It was reported that her husband was also watching. Don't worry, Gun, it might have been worse — he might have been sitting at the other end of the table!

During the late session on Sunday, one Polish player was drunk (only one? says Tihana, there must be something wrong there!). Only this one was slightly more drunk than all the others. He was a little too loud, but very friendly, and chatting loudly with his opponents, who happened to be Polish during two rounds. No problems then, but I was dreading what would happen if his last opponents weren't Polish. We were all lucky there, as it happened to befall on an Irish pair to welcome him to their table. All went well, until he called in a loud voice for Director. What was he up to? Would he ask me to fetch him another Vodka? No, it was a real call. The Irishman, sober as anything, had revoked! It cost them an overtrick (that's called being lucky at teams) which did not even translate into an IMP because the contract wasn't reached at the other table. The luck of the Irish.

Tihana had provided us with uniforms (so I cannot even wear my Cravattes in Hrvatska any more), and while she informed me that she had asked for Magenta coloured T-shirts, they had ended up being orange. ## **INTERVIEW**

# The Rimstedt brothers - Mikael & Ola

1. Your family is probably the top bridge family in the world. How does it feel? Who is the best?

It's a special feeling. No matter where you are with your family there will always be conversations about bridge. We are all playing on a professional level and therefore we can always keep our discussions about bridge on the highest level.

**Mikael**: "Obviously this question has been asked by many people many times. I usually try to refuse answer such questions when I don't think it's clear. About three-four years ago most people would probably say Cecilia to be the best player but after last few years my opinion has changed".

Ola: "It's an amazing feeling. Travel all around the world and competing on the highest level is one thing, but be able to do it with your family is beyond amazing. Who is the best? I will say that we are all good at different things. If there is anything that stands out between any of us, that is up for the people around us to decide."

2. For how long have you been playing? When did you start to play bridge, how it all started?

Bridge is a game that has been around our family for many generations. Sandra and Cecilia (sisters) tought us bridge when we were about five years old, but from the day we went to our first international tournament in 2008 I think that's when our career started to get more serious. So about nine years of serious bridge.

3. What do you expect from your bridge partner, what qualities he/she must have? What you particularly dislike in a partnership or bridge attitude?

Mikael: I expect my partner to be able to practise often and always have the goal to become a better bridgeplayer. Then my partner must be able take criticism and also be able to have a discussion when an error has occured during a session. I dislike partners who can't admit their mistakes and trying to convince me he's right about something without having a discussion about it.

**Ola:** "Everybody is different and want different things from your partner. I admittedly am quite sensitive to criticism, but at the same time I love listening to others opinion. I don't think there is a universal quality that fits onto every individual. The most important qualities that partnerships must have - be able listen, discuss and don't think that you are much better than your partner."

4. How was Bermuda Bowl?

Bermuda Bowl was a huge experience for our career. Being only 22 years old, we think we've reached very far only by being qualified to play for Sweden who also were one of the top-tanked teams by many.

5. Do you feel that top bridge has changed after cheaters had been discovered and banned?

**Mikael:** Absolutely. Before it was always the same teams who reached the semi-finals and final-stage and always the same pairs who had the best individual results in their teams. Nowdays, as we could see in the Bermuda Bowl, there are teams who did very well and probably never expected to do so from the beginning.

**Ola:** "Without a doubt. We tend to hear nowadays that we are lucky to join the top at this stage. It's a new era for the game, basically any team in any major tournament can win today. Me and many others are forever grateful for what Boye Brogeland accomplished with his work of cleaning up this marvelous game we love."

6. What do you do when you are not busy with bridge?

Mikael: I am playing a game called Padeltennis about 3-4 times a week. It is fairly new in Sweden but very popular in Spain and South America. Also Italy and France has a few courts here and there. During the summer I like spending as much time as I can on the golfcourt. I'm quite a solid 6-hcp player in golf if anyone would like a challenge there as well!

Ola: "At home I often play a game called Padeltennis, a combination of tennis and squash. Apart from that, I love to cook and watch different kind of TV series and reality shows."

7. Once when you grow up, do you see yourself as professional bridge player, or there is something else you would like to do for living? How will your future look like?

**Mikael**: I never expected I would make a living by playing bridge but time changed when I was doing better and better. I've always had a dream I someday would work full time with something I really enjoy and have bridge as a bonus on the side. We will see how the future looks like but right now I'm very focused on getting best in bridge.

Ola: "I did a lot of different kinds of sports when I was again. We are all looking forward to this festival! younger. I played golf, tabletennis, soccer for many years. Obviously bridge has been a part of my life throughout my entire childhood, and I honestly remember the days in primary school where I said to myself "I want to be a professional bridgeplayer when I grow up". Here I am today and I have no regrets."

8. We must ask you, girls insisted, your private life... anyone special there?

Mikael: Hehe... I was afraid this question would appear sooner or later. Let's say I was going into the Bermuda Bowl as the single Mikael who always loved being single. But right now I'm meeting someone who also might come to Pula.

**Ola:** Not right now.

9. You are attending Pula bridge festival for the first time. What brings you here?

Mikael: I have the three recent years chose to go to the greek island bridge festival because I have always been a huge fan of Rhodes. But everyone need some variation and everyone has never said one negative thing about Pula. I've only heard great reviews so there was no reason I was gonna miss it this year

Ola: "I've been playing bridge entire summer and weeks before that. I need a vacation to rest, and vacation for me is great friends, summer weather and a bit of bridge to finish it all up. I like to travel and try new things. I've been to greek bridgefestival the past years and many Swedes are going to Pula every year which is usually going on at the same time. Only good things to say about Pula, I find no reason why I wouldn't give it a go."

- Your mobile phone, and any other electronic devices, must be switched off and put on the table or chair next to you. Or leave them in your room.

- The convention card is not obligatory, but we recommend it. Please feel free to take a copy at the Registration desk.
- ♠ Make your opening leads face down.
- Leave the boards and the bidding boxes on the table.
- entry fee at Registration desk at the time of A Be nice to your partner, opponents, officials of the tournament and others...only together can we make this tournament a friendly and comfortable place for all.
  - **♠** Follow the ALERT procedure!
  - 1 NT opening bid, if not 15-18 balanced variety must be alerted!
  - 1NT opening bid on hands that can have less than 10 HCP is not allowed.
  - ♠ HUM and Brown Sticker methods are not allowed (please check with TD if you are not sure about conventions you use).
  - Do not alert any bids higher than 3NT.
  - Psychics of strong openings are not allowed. Strong openings are when the minimum is 15 HCP or more.
